Inspection for damage should be carried out on set up	Designated supervisors to ensure that the children follow safety rules and do not pick up the equipment from the ground
All games	Children putting equipment into mouth causing a choking hazard	1	1	Ensure that all equipment is safe for age 3 and upwards, o persons under 3 to use the games.	Designated supervisors and parents to watch children's play at all times

All games	Children slipping or falling over equipment	1	2	Ensure that there is lots of space around the games	Ensure that the equipment is kept tidy and not scattered around the floor
Limbo game Jenga Game Connect 4 game	Risk of children taking parts and hitting each other with them	1	2	Ensure equipment is in safe and good condition with no damage.	Designated supervisors and parents to watch children's play at all times
Bubble machine	Risk of users slipping on a wet floor	1	2	Use outdoors only to reduce risk of slipping on the floor.	Designated supervisors and parents to have a towel available to clean up any wet surfaces
